

Bible Board Game Project

Assignment: You are a board game manufacturer, and you have been assigned the task of creating a game that will help students review what you have learned about the life of Christ this year in a fun and interesting way!

Remember all those great games you have played? Well, now you can make your own with your own rules, design, and questions! The only thing is, you must relate it to the life for Christ. First, before you start thinking about your “new” design, look at the list of board games below and choose ones that you like to play, or ones that you have played before.

The publisher wants the following elements incorporated into the game:

1. Using a file folder, colored paper, colored pencils, and markers, create a game board. Put the name of your game on the tab of the folder and decorate the inside so that it is a game board. Make it neat, colorful, interesting, and creative!
2. Create at least 60 questions (10 questions from each unit covered) and answers for your game that relate to the life of Christ. The questions must be somehow incorporated into playing the game. Print or write neatly the questions on 3” X 5” index cards cut in half. Don’t forget to include the answers to each question.
3. Write directions for your game that would make it perfectly clear how to play the game. Type the directions and glue them to the back cover of the file folder. In your directions be sure to include: object of the game (decide how the game is won); equipment (What is necessary to play the game?); set up (How do you set up the board before you play the game? How do you decide who takes the first turn?); rules of play (How does a player move around the board? Are there penalties for wrong answers? How many players can play?)
4. For 2-5 players
