Looding Domination		Hamo of Horia Hon
1	This world view was clearly dominant in the Western world up to end of 17 <sup>th</sup> century. Believes God is infinite, personal, transcendent, omniscient, sovereign, and good.	New Age
2	Developed as an attempt to bring unity out of a chaos of theological and philosophical discussion. Views God as "First Cause" but believes He has now left the universe to run on its own. "Clockwork" view.	Eastern Pantheism
3	Matter exists eternally and is all there is. God does not exist. Human beings are nothing more than complex machines.	Existentialism
4	The absolute denial of everything—even the reality of existence itself.	Nihilism
5	For human beings alone, existence precedes essence—people make themselves what they are. Each person is totally free in regard to his nature and destiny. Emphasizes importance of relationship.	Naturalism
6	The soul of each human being is the Soul of the cosmos. There are many roads that lead to the One (God) and many gods along the way.	Deism
7	Whatever the nature of being, the self is the king- pin, the prime reality. The human race is on the verge of a radical change that will transform the world.	Christian Theism

God is omniscient. He possesses unlimited capabilities. He is immediately, consciously, and comprehensively aware of all eternal and all temporal realities that ever were, are, or will be.

### Ethically...

God is simultaneously holy, just, merciful, and loving.

#### **Emotionally...**

God detests evil, and is long suffering and compassionate.

Genesis 15:17; Lamentations 3:22, Nahum 1:3; Matthew 15:32; 20:34; Hebrews 2:10, 18

#### Volitionally...

God is free, authentic, and omnipotent. Nothing is impossible. God can accomplish whatever He wills.

Isaiah 14:24-27; II Chronicles 7:14; Mark 14:33-36; Luke 7:30; Romans 1:24; Cor. 2:11, 13:4-5.

### Physically...

God is not bound by time or space. He is omnipresent. Wherever you go, there God is.

#### READ REVELATION 12:7-12

<sup>7</sup>And there was war in heaven. 


